PROJECT SUMMARY

The “**3R for a Greener Future: Youth for a Sustainable Planet**” project is an Erasmus+ Youth Exchange aimed at raising young people's awareness of environmental protection, sustainable living, and recycling. The project will bring together young people from Türkiye, Spain, Portugal, Croatia, Romania, and Ukraine to participate in environmental workshops, recycling activities, intercultural events, and non-formal learning-based activities.

The project seeks to enhance young people's active citizenship, teamwork skills, and environmentally friendly lifestyles.   

PROJECT BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE


Today, the world is facing serious environmental challenges such as:


- Climate change
- Environmental pollution
- Overconsumption
- Depletion of natural resources
- Plastic waste
- Loss of biodiversity

Young generations are among those most directly affected by these challenges. However, many young people still lack sufficient knowledge, experience, and opportunities to actively engage in sustainable living practices.

The “**3R for a Greener Future**” project aims to raise awareness about environmental sustainability and empower young people to become active contributors to environmental solutions.

The project is based on the three fundamental principles of sustainability:

 **REDUCE** – Reduce unnecessary consumption

 **REUSE** – Promote a culture of reusing materials and products

 **RECYCLE** – Encourage recycling and proper waste management

Through this project, young people will be encouraged to:

- Develop environmentally friendly lifestyle habits
- Increase their awareness of sustainability issues
- Create innovative solutions to environmental challenges
- Strengthen intercultural cooperation and collaboration

TARGET GROUP







The target group of the project consists of young people aged **17–25**. The project aims to bring together young people who are interested in environmental protection, sustainability, and recycling, who are open to intercultural learning, and who are willing to take an active role in international activities.

Special priority will be given to the participation of young people with fewer opportunities, including those living in rural areas and those facing economic or social disadvantages.

To ensure the successful implementation of the project, participants are expected to complete several preparations before the mobility begins. This process will help participants engage more actively and effectively in the project activities.

The main preparations required before the mobility are outlined below:

■ **Submission of Participant Information**

Participants must complete the Google Form provided by the coordinating organization and submit their personal information, contact details, and travel information.

✦ **Participant Selection and Information**

Participants will be selected by the partner organizations and will be thoroughly informed about the project and its activities.

Participants must share their travel plans with the coordinating organization and receive approval before purchasing tickets.

⚠ Tickets purchased without prior approval will not be reimbursed.

Preparation on Project Topics

Participants are expected to conduct preliminary research on the project themes.

PT **Portugal:** Sustainable lifestyle habits

HR **Croatia:** Protection of marine and water resources

RO **Romania:** Environmental volunteering and youth participation

UA **Ukraine:** Environmental awareness campaigns and youth initiatives

In addition, each country will prepare at least **one ice-breaker activity**.

Cultural Night Preparation

Participants should prepare materials to introduce their countries.

📁 Digital Devices (Optional)

Bringing a laptop or tablet is not mandatory.

However, participants are encouraged to bring a device for group work activities.

Having at least one device per national group will be sufficient.

📁 Online Preparation Meetings

Online meetings will be organized before the project to provide participants with information and preparation guidance.

🛡️ Insurance

All participants are required to obtain travel health insurance.

Please note that the **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) is not valid in Türkiye.**

✈️ TRAVEL AND FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

Participation in the Erasmus+ Youth Exchange project “**3R for a Greener Future: Youth for a Sustainable Planet**” is free of charge for selected participants.

The project budget will cover the main costs related to accommodation, meals, and project activities throughout the mobility.

✈️ Travel Arrangements

Participants are responsible for arranging their travel from their home countries to Türkiye. The nearest airport is **Ankara Esenboğa Airport**.

The coordinating organization, **EKIP Association**, will organize round-trip transfers between Ankara Esenboğa Airport and Kırıkkale. This service will be provided if at least three participants from the same national group travel together.

If only one or two participants travel separately, airport transfers will not be covered, and those participants will be responsible for arranging their own transportation.

All travel plans must be submitted to the coordinating organization and approved before purchasing tickets. Travel costs for tickets purchased without prior approval will not be reimbursed.

📄 Travel Reimbursement

Travel expenses will be reimbursed according to the Erasmus+ distance-band funding rules and within the approved project budget.

The following documents are required for reimbursement:

- Flight or transportation tickets
- Boarding passes
- Invoices or proof of payment
- Any other documents proving the journey

After all required documents have been submitted, reimbursements will be made by bank transfer in **Euro (EUR)**.

□ **Reimbursement Timeline**

Travel reimbursements are usually processed within **1–3 months after the mobility**, and no later than **6 months** after the completion of the project activities.

To ensure a smooth and timely reimbursement process, participants must upload all required documents to the designated Google Drive folder and complete all mandatory participant reports.

☉ **Accommodation and Meals**

✦ **Personal Expenses**

HOW TO REACH KIRIKKALE



The nearest airport to our city is **Ankara Esenboğa Airport**. Kirikkale is located in the Central Anatolia Region of Türkiye, approximately **76 km from Ankara**, the capital city of the country.

Participants are required to arrange their travel plans according to the following dates:

 **Arrival Day:** 26 August 2026

 **Departure Day:** 2 September 2026

The fastest way to reach Kırıkkale is via **Ankara Esenboğa Airport**. After arriving at the airport, participants can travel to Kırıkkale either by minibus, bus, or train.

FROM ISTANBUL AIRPORT (IST) AND ISTANBUL SABIHA GÖKÇEN AIRPORT (SAW) TO KIRIKKALE

A. If Your Flight Arrives at Istanbul Airport (IST)

You can travel from Istanbul to Kırıkkale by intercity bus.

First, you need to travel from Istanbul Airport to the **Esenler Bus Terminal (Otogar)**.

HAVAIST Airport Shuttle Buses provide a comfortable and convenient connection between Istanbul Airport and Esenler Bus Terminal.

Route: Istanbul Airport → Esenler Bus Terminal (HAVAIST)

After arriving at Esenler Bus Terminal, you can take an intercity bus to Kırıkkale.

B. If Your Flight Arrives at Sabiha Gökçen Airport (SAW)

You should first travel from Sabiha Gökçen Airport to **Gebze Bus Terminal**.

Bus line **250G** operates daily between:

Sabiha Gökçen Airport → Gebze Bus Terminal

Additional information:

- The route includes 8 stops.
- The journey takes approximately 29 minutes.

After reaching Gebze Bus Terminal, you can continue to Kırıkkale by intercity bus.

TRANSPORTATION FROM ANKARA ESENBOĞA AIRPORT TO KIRIKKALE

1. Private Transfer Service

If there are at least **three participants from the same country group**, the project organizers will arrange a minibus transfer from Ankara Esenboğa Airport directly to the accommodation venue in Kırıkkale.

This is the fastest transportation option and will be covered by the project budget within the available travel funds.

2. Public Transportation

There are several ways to travel from Ankara Esenboğa Airport to **AŞTİ (Ankara Intercity Bus Terminal)**.

Participants may choose the option that best suits their needs.

The **EGO Airport Bus No. 442** operates between Esenboğa Airport and AŞTİ.

After arriving at the bus terminal, participants can travel to Kırıkkale using buses operated by:

- Es Turizm
- Gümüşsoy Turizm
- Özen Turizm

3. Taxi Option

Participants may take a taxi directly from Esenboğa Airport to either:

- AŞTİ Bus Terminal, or
- Kırıkkale city centre.

This option is faster but may be more expensive than public transportation.

4. Alternative Option – Train

Participants may travel from Esenboğa Airport to **Ankara Train Station** and then continue to Kırıkkale by train.

Useful information:

- The distance between the airport and Ankara city centre is approximately 29 km.
- Municipal Bus (442-3) services operate approximately every 20 minutes.
- HAVAŞ Airport Shuttle services depart approximately 25 minutes after flight arrivals.
- The HAVAŞ terminal is located approximately 700 metres from Ankara Train Station.

Erasmus + Youth Exchange

Participants will be accommodated at the **Yeşil Vadi Şehit Musa Saydam Vocational and Technical Anatolian High School Practice Hotel** in Kırıkkale throughout the project. Accommodation will be provided in hotel-standard rooms prepared for participants.

Since the accommodation facility and the project activity venues are located within the same campus, participants will have easy access to training rooms, workshop areas, and outdoor activity spaces.

Rooms will generally be arranged for **2 or 3 participants**. Participants are expected to respect their roommates, keep shared areas clean, and comply with the rules of the accommodation facility.

☉ Meal Arrangements

The following meals will be provided daily throughout the project:

- Breakfast
- Lunch
- Dinner

In addition, coffee breaks and light refreshments will be offered during training and activity sessions.

Participants who have vegetarian, vegan, allergy-related, or other special dietary requirements must indicate this information in the participant form before the mobility.

Accommodation and meal services are fully covered by the project budget. Participants are not required to pay any additional fees for these services.

📍 ACTIVITY VENUE

The training sessions, workshops, environmental activities, and intercultural events of the Erasmus+ Youth Exchange project **“3R for a Greener Future: Youth for a Sustainable Planet”** will take place on the campus of **Yeşil Vadi Şehit Musa Saydam Practice Hotel** in Kırıkkale, Türkiye.

The following facilities will be used throughout the project:

- **Conference Hall** – Training sessions, presentations, group work, environmental workshops, and evaluation meetings
- **Workshop Areas** – 3R (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) activities, Upcycling Hackathon sessions, creative recycling practices, and sustainable living workshops
- **Outdoor Areas** – Team-building activities, environmental games, intercultural events, and social activities
- **Outdoor Sports and Activity Areas** – Energizers, environment-themed team games, and outdoor learning activities

Throughout the project, participants will take part in practical learning activities focusing on:

- Recycling
- Zero-waste practices
- Renewable energy
- Water management
- Sustainable living
- Citizen Science

In addition, study visits will be organized to explore the natural and cultural heritage of Kırıkkale, including:

- Çeşnigir Bridge
- Keskin Sulu Cave
- Kırıkkale National Garden (Millet Bahçesi)

During these visits, participants will engage in environmental observation activities, photography and video production, and cultural learning experiences.

As the accommodation, training facilities, and activity areas are located within the same campus, participants will have easy access to all activities, ensuring the smooth and efficient implementation of the project programme.

PROJECT RULES

- Full participation in all project activities is mandatory.
- The use of alcohol and illegal drugs is strictly prohibited.
- Any form of discrimination will not be tolerated.
- Erasmus+ visibility and communication guidelines must be respected.
- Participants are expected to follow the instructions of group leaders and facilitators at all times.

CULTURAL AND STUDY VISITS



Visits to **Çeşnigir Bridge and Recreation Area, Hacı Taşan Cultural House, and Keskin Sulu Cave** will be organized as part of the project activities.

In addition to these visits, the coordinating country, Türkiye, may organize an optional excursion to the **Cappadocia Region** based on participants' interest and demand.

The Cappadocia trip is **not a mandatory part of the project programme** and will only be considered if there is sufficient participant interest and the available budget allows.

If the estimated costs of the excursion exceed the available travel budget, participants may be asked to contribute to the additional expenses.

Participation in the Cappadocia trip is entirely voluntary. A survey will be conducted among participants, and the final decision on whether the trip will take place will depend on the preference of the majority.
